Lighting the Fourth Advent Candle - Love

One reader: This morning, we continue our Advent journey by lighting the candle of love.

ALL: The words of Scripture fill us with delight that God's love is incarnate, is embodied, in our Savior, Jesus Christ.

Another: Receive these words, recorded for us in John's first letter, chapter 4, verses 7 through 12:

Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God;

ALL: everyone who loves is born of God and knows God.

Another: Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. God's love was revealed among us in this way:

ALL: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him.

Another: In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins.

ALL: Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another.

Another: No one has ever seen God;

ALL: if we love one another, God lives in us, and his love is perfected in us.

One reader: Over a hundred people,

from the ages of two to eighty years old, were asked the question,

"What makes you feel connected; what makes you feel loved?"

From the voices of different generations, hear their answers,

each of which points us to Christ,

who was born and lived on earth as the embodiment of love.

Another: Handwritten notes.

One reader: Casseroles.

Another: Being invited in.

One reader: Reading a book together.

Another: The passing of the peace.

One reader: Family walks.

Another: Youth group.

One reader: When I see my friends at preschool.

Another: Surprise phone calls.

One reader: Making music with other people.

Another: Belly laughs.

One reader: An inside joke.

Another: Dancing with my spouse in the kitchen.

ALL: Today we light the candle of love.

May its light remind us that God's son, Jesus Christ, is love.

May He allow us to know God more fully

and enable us to weave deeper connections between neighbors.

(The fourth candle is lighted.)

One reader: In a lonely world, let this light shine bright. From the very first generation, God has surrounded us with love. From generation to generation, we are held in God's love.

ALL: Thanks be to God for that good news. Amen.

OPEN GYM SESSIONS DURING CHRISTMAS BREAK

We're thrilled to bring back a beloved OCOF tradition this winter break: **Open Gym!** On **December 23, 27, 30, and January 2** the Roy Hall Gym will be open from **9 a.m. to 4 p.m.** for families to enjoy. This is a fantastic opportunity for kids to play, stay active, and burn off some energy during the break. We hope you'll join us and make the most of this fun and relaxed time together!

Please note that this is **not a staffed event**, so if you choose to participate, you'll need to fill out a liability form at the front desk as well as use the sign in/sign out sheet. Here are a few important guidelines:

- An adult must be present to supervise their children at all times.
- At least two adults must be present at all times, in accordance with the Child Protection Policy.
- **If more than 5 children are participating,** an additional adult who is not directly related to the family is required.
- **Clean up after your group is finished.** We share this space with other groups and the school, so it's essential to leave it clean and ready for the next users.

This event is open to everyone—feel free to spread the word to other families who might be interested! We hope this provides a fun and safe option for keeping kids active during the winter break. Let both the youth director and children's director know if you have any questions!

This year's Christmas Eve special offering will go towards the First Friends ministry to Syrian immigrants. Primarily an outreach to Syrian refugees who came to the United States because of the civil war in Syria. The ministry—started by Sally Ivaska, Pastor Younan Shiba, and Caryl Weinberg—began in 2016, with an Iftar dinner for newly arrived Muslim refugees, hosted by First Presbyterian Evanston and Syrian Christians for peace. It was followed by First Pres hosting a Thanksgiving dinner and then grew into the

training and equipping of volunteer teams to be friends to families located near Evanston. After adopting some 10 families as friends, the ministry, now under the leadership of Bridgette Gilchrist, has grown to embrace 24 individuals and families. And it continues to grow as these friends bring their friends to experience the love and "peace" they feel at the church and interacting with all our volunteers.
